Section 3. All Ordinances or parts thereof in conflict
herewith are hereby repealed.

Ordinance Bill No 84 ~~Repealed by
Ordinance No 80 97~~
An Ordinance to establish a Curb Stone
and Curb grade for the City of Lebanon,
and to establish the depth of the Street
line below the top of Curb, and to provide
the manner and material for the
construction of curbs.

The people of the City of Lebanon, do ordain
as follows:

Section 1. All Curbs hereafter made in the city
of Lebanon of whatever material shall be
constructed out eight ft from the
adjacent lot line, and the top of the curb
shall be on a line with the street grade,
and shall also be on a line with the
sidewalk grade,

Section 2. All cement Curbs built with a cement side walk and as a part of the walk shall be twelve inches deep and the walk shall be built on top the Curb. All cement Curbs built independent and separate and apart from the Cement walk shall be not less than 16" deep and shall be not less than eight inches wide at the base and not less than four inches wide at the top and built of the same material and manner of building cement sidewalks

Section 3.

All wooden curbs shall be made of 3 by 12 inch red or yellow Fir lumber securely spiked to posts firmly set in the ground on the lot or inside of the Curb.


Section 4.

The depth of the street line at the Curb shall be 12 inches below the top of the Curb.
