Ordinance No 81.

An Ordinance to extend and open and lay out a street to be known as Third Street in the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, from north terminous of Third Street to the north boundary line of Jeremiah Ralston's D. L. Co. Claim No 49, in T.P. 12 S. R. 2 West.

Whereas, the Common Council of the City of Lebanon deem it for the best interest of the said City of Lebanon, Linn County Oregon, to open, extend and lay out a street 60 feet wide over and along the following route and land to wit: Beginning at a point which is 20 feet west of the Northwest corner of Block No 17 in Ralston's ~~Third~~ Addition to Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, as the same appears and is designated on the map and plat of said addition now on file and of record in the office of the recorder, of and for said Linn County, said point being 20 feet east of the east boundary line of the right of way of the Oregon & California Railroad Company. The said Street to be 60 feet wide and being 20 feet on either side of the said line, and extending from said point following the course of the said right of way in a northerly and north westerly direction to the north boundary line of the Donation land Claim of Jeremiah Ralston and wife, the same being Claim No. 49 in Township 12, South of Range, 2 West of the Willamette Meridian, in Linn County, Oregon. The said Street being in the City of Lebanon, Oregon.

The People of the City of Lebanon do Ordain as follows:

Section 1. The Council of the City of Lebanon deem it for the best interest of the city of opening lay out and extend Third Street over and upon the

line and route hereinbefore and hereinafter described and set out.

Section 2 That the line and route of the said street so laid out, extended and opened be over and along the following route and line and thirty feet on either side thereof, to-wit: Beginning at a point which is 30 feet west of the northwest corner of Block No. 17 in Ralston's Second Addition to Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, as the same appears and is designated on the map and plat of said Addition now on file and of record in the office of the Recorder of Land for Linn County, Oregon, said point being 30 feet east of the east line of the right of way of the Oregon & California Railroad Company, the said street to be 60 feet wide and extending and running from said point following the course of the said right of way in a northerly and northwesterly direction with the curves and turns of said right of way to the north boundary line of the Donation Land claim of Peremiah Ralston and wife claim No 49 in Township 12 south of range 2 West of the Willamette Meridian, in Linn County, Oregon, the said street being in the City of Lebanon.

Section 3 That notice of the proposal of the City to lay out, open and extend the said street be published in the Lebanon Criterion a newspaper published in said City once a week and of general circulation in said city, County and State, that the same be published for four weeks together with this Ordinance.

Section 4 That the Council hereby fixes and sets the 6<sup>th</sup> day of October, 1908 at 8 O'clock p. m. at the regular meeting of the Council at the Council

Chamber's in said City as the time and place for hearing and determining any and all remonstrances and objections to the opening, laying out and extending the said street as herein proposed and for the appointment of referees to assess the damages and benefits to adjacent and abutting or other property by reason of the opening, laying out or extending the said street, and to determine and do any other thing necessary in the laying out opening and extending the said street as aforesaid.

Section 5 - This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after Thirty days from its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
