

ORDINANCE BILL 118

ORDINANCE NO. 116,  
117

An ordinance to provide for the manner of placing electric light for the lighting of the streets of the City of Lebanon, Oregon,

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:-

Section 1:- That all lights placed for the city of Lebanon and to be paid for by the said city, other than ~~Arm~~ light, be placed and suspended to poles or posts firmly planted in the ground on a line with the electric light poles <sup>and other poles</sup> as now or may be hereafter provided by ordinance, and at a height not to exceed ten feet above the level of the sidewalk grade as now or may hereafter be established.

Section 2:- That the said lights be placed and suspended to arms extending out from the said poles or posts at a distance from the said posts of poles not less than three feet and ~~xxxx~~ towards to sidewalk line of the street, and in such manner that the shadow of the pole or post will not fall on the sidewalk of either street at or near the said light.

Section 3:- That all electric lights now placed in the said city herein mentioned that do not conform to the provisions of this ordinance be made to conform thereto with 30 days from and after the passage of this ordinance by the council.

Section 4:- That all electric lights in the said city which do not conform to this ordinance within 30 days from and after the passage of the ordinance by the council, be not paid for by the said city, or deemed a part of the lights to be furnished to the said city, under any contract with the said city with any person or company.
