

ORDINANCE BILL NO. 118

ORDINANCE NO. 117
112

An Ordinance to regulate the speed of Automobiles, Motor Vehicles, Motor Cycles, Vehicles, Engines, trains, cars, bicycles, carriages, street cars and all other travel on the streets of the City of Lebanon within the limits of the said City.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:-

Section 1:- No person, driver, or operator in charge of any automobile, motor vehicle, or motorcycle, bicycle, electric car, or railroad engine, or railroad train of cars or any carriage, wagon or other vehicle, or in charge of any team, horse or animal on any alley or highway or public thoroughfare street within the corporate limits of the City of Lebanon, shall drive, operate or move or permit the same or any of them to be driven, operated or moved at a rate of speed faster or greater than 12 miles an hour, or within the thickly settled or business portions of the said city at a rate of speed faster or greater than 10 miles an hour.

Section 3:- It shall be the duty of the Marshall of the City of Lebanon to place in a conspicuous place on every main street leading into the said city at the boundary line of the said city where the same crosses the said street a sign of sufficient size to be easily seen and read by persons using the same bearing the words "Slow down to 12 miles".

Section 4:- No automobile, team, vehicle or motor vehicle shall be left standing on ~~Main~~ street within the fire limits for a longer time than fifteen minutes at any one time, or in front of the the place of business or residence of any person without the consent of the owner ~~the~~ of the said building or the the occupant of the said building and place of business.

Section 5:- All motorvehicles, carriages, motorcycles teams and

Section 2:- Every ~~motor cycle~~ ^{motor vehicle} or automobile shall be equipped with at least two white head light and one rear red light which shall be kept ⁿburning at all times at night when such vehicle is in use on any street in the said city, And all motor cycles shall have one white head light when being run or operated on any street in the said city at night.

other vehicles when being driven, operated or moved on any street within the said city shall go upon the right side of the street, and at all intersections of streets where they make a turn into any cross street and intending to turn to the *right* shall keep close to the curb line, and when turning to the left shall go beyond the center of the intersection, and all vehicles or motorvehicles or moter cycles shall be under full control of the per driving or operating the same. At all intersections the vehicle approaching the intersection from the right of any other vehicle approaching the same intersection shall have the right of way, and the other shall slow down.

Section 6:- All vehicles proceeding in opposite directions shall pass to the right, of each other giving one-half of the street to each. Vehicles proceeding in the same direction overtaking another the overtaking vehicle shall pass to the left and vehicle being over taken giving sufficient room for that purpose, giving one-half of the right side of the road or street, if the same can be done in safety.

Section 7:- All motorvehicles, automobiles, and motrocycles approaching any team, or in passing any team shall have his machine and vehicles under full controll, and shall use due care and diligence in preventing accident or runaways, and if such team becomes fractious, frightened, or apperently unmanagable, he shall stop his vehicle and he shall render such assistance as the circumstances shall demand to prevent accident, injury or runaways.

Section 8:- Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof before the recorders court by fined not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$100.00 or by imprisonment in the city jail not less than five days nor more than 50 days.
