ORDINANCE NO. 123

An Ordinance to regulate the storing of Dynamite, giant powder, Nitro Glycerine, Blasting Powder, Gun Powder, and other explosives within the City of Lebanon.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:-

Section 1: It shall be unlawful for any person, persons, firm, company or corporation to keep or store in any building or place within the corporate limits of the city of Lebanon, in Linn County, Oregon, ~~within 300 feet of any residence, store or place of business or any house or place where any person lives,~~ any greater quantity of Dynamite, Giant powder, nitro glycerine, blasting powder, Gun powder, or other explosives of like or any other nature or kind, than ~~150~~ pounds at any one time, and said ~~100~~ pound quantities shall be kept in a safe and secure place and handled with the utmost care, and shall be kept in such places and manner as now provided by ordinance.

Section 2:- All such explosives as mentioned in section One of this ordinance which are stored within the city limits as herein provided in greater quantities than ~~100~~ pounds shall be stored and kept in buildings or houses specially constructed for that purpose, and shall be so constructed that the same will have free air circulation and ventilation through the outer walls, at both top and bottom on at least three sides of the building, and all such buildings shall be built and constructed in a solid and substantial manner and of non combustible material, and fire proof from both inside and outside, and the said building shall be kept securely locked, at all times when not under the direct care of the persons having the same in charge and using the same, in placing such explosives in or removing the same from such Building.

Section 3:- Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon con

viction thereof before the recorder's Court shall be fined not less than Ten Dollars nor more than One Hundred Dollars, or by imprisonment in the City Jail not less than Five days nor more than Fifty days.

Section 3:- That in as much as dynamite and other explosives are stored in the business district and near residences in large quantities and the health, peace and safety of the city and its inhabitants are thereby greatly endangered, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and it is necessary that this ordinance become effective at once, This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the council and approval by the mayor.

Passed by the council this ⁴10th day of ^{Leby}June, 1912, the same having the affirmative vote of received more than three fourth of all members elected to the council. taken by aye and no vote on the roll call.
