## A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE.

## ORDINANCE NO. 155-

An Ordinance Establishing the Compensation of the Mayor and Members of the City Council.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the Mayor, and each member of the City Council of the City of Lebanon, shall each receive, as full compensation for his or her services as such officer, the sum of One Dollar for each regular or special meeting of the City Council attended by him or her, which sums shall be allowed and paid quarterly.

Section 2. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

To The Honorable Members of the Common Council of the City,

of Lebanon, Oregon.

Gentlemen:-

I hereby return to your Honorable Body Ordinance Bill Entitled

" An Ordinance Establishing the compensation of the Mayor and members
of the City Coincil"

Passed by you March 3rd 1914, without my approval.

The reasons for my not approving of this ordinance is that there is no restrictions as to the humber of meetings for which payment may be had, and there is no penalty for non attendence, other than no pay.

In advocating such an ordinance when a member of the council it was not for the purpose of having its members recieve some pay for the services, but to compel attendence and attention to the business of the city, and all those features of the ordinance are wanting.

This same measure has been before the council some three or four times prior to its passage and the council has an many times rejected, it, and the manner in which the prdinance is passed will only leave the impression that it is the pay the council is after and not the good and welfare of the city.
