ORDINANCE NO. 156.

An Ordinance Establishing the Sidewalk Grade on a part of Main Street, and Requiring the Building of a Sidewalk.

- - - - -

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the sidewalk grade on the West side of Main Street in said City, commencing at a point which is seventy-two (72) feet South of the South line of Carolina Street, continued, and extending thence North a distance of seventy-two (72) feet, be, and the same is hereby, changed and established, and the same shall hereafter be, as follows, to-wit: Commencing at said point of beginning on the grade heretofore established and existing, being at an elevation of 94.1 feet above the City datum now recognized in City surveys in said City, and sloping on a uniform upward grade of two per cent. (2%) to meet the present walk at a point seventy-two (72) feet North of said place of beginning, which point is at an elevation of 95.5 feet above said datum.

Section 2. That the owners of the property abutting on the West side of said part of Main Street where said grade is so established by this ordinance, be, and they are hereby, required to construct and conplete within thirty (30) days from the date of the approval of this ordinance by the Mayor, a concrete sidewalk five feet wide on said grade so established and for said distance of seventy-two (72) feet, said work to be done in accordance with the specifications for concrete walks now in force as set forth in Ordinance No.74 of said City; and that, in case of the failure of said property owners so to construct said walk, the Superintendent of Streets of said City beg and he is hereby authorized and directed to construct the same on bahalf of the City, the cost

thereof to be charged as a lien upon and against the said abutting property, and entered upon the Docket of City Liens.

<u>Section 3.</u> All acts and resolutions, and parts of acts and resolutions, in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed.

Section 4. That, inasmuch as the sidewalk now existing in front of the premises above mentioned is in such condition as to be unsafe and dangerous, in the judgment of the Council, to persons passing along the same, the South end of the present walk being about two feet higher than the North end of the walk next adjoining it on the South, and about two feet above the established grade, and the Superintendent of Streets has made written report of such defective and dangerous condition, this ordinance is necessary to the peace, health and safety of the City, and the same shall therefore be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
