

ORDINANCE NO. 157.

An Ordinance concerning the regulation of pool tables and billiard tables kept by or for corporations, associations, societies and clubs.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEBANON.

Section 1. That the owners, lessees and persons in charge of any and all pool tables and billiard tables kept, conducted or operated, in the City of Lebanon, Oregon, by, or for the use of the members of, any corporation, association, society or club, and of the rooms where such tables are so kept, conducted or operated, shall comply in all respects with the provisions and requirements of the ordinances of said City in regard to the keeping of billiard and pool tables for hire or profit.

Section 2. Any person, whether as principal, agent or employe, violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars (\$10) nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100), or by imprisonment for not less than five (5) days nor more than fifty (50) days, or both.

Section 3. In the opinion of the Council this ordinance is necessary to the peace, health and safety of the city, for the reason that one or more clubs are now operating in said City in a manner which the Council deems detrimental to the moral welfare of the community; therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its approval by the Mayor.
