

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE.

ORDINANCE NO. 160.

An Ordinance authorizing the purchase of certain
fire apparatus.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That, whereas the Committee on Streets and Public Property has reported to the Council that the Fire Department of said City is in need of certain fire apparatus, including a truck, ladders, helmets, hose couplings and other small articles of equipment, and that A. G. Long, of Portland, Oregon, has offered to furnish the same at an aggregate price of \$373.58, and that, in the opinion of said Committee said price is reasonable and as low as said articles can be purchased for, and the Council approves said report, therefore, the Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract on behalf of said City, with the said A. G. Long, for the purchase of said apparatus and equipment at an aggregate price not in excess of the sum above mentioned, and said sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of the general funds of the City for the payment therefor.

Section 2. That, inasmuch as the fire apparatus of the City is inadequate at the present time, this ordinance is necessary to the peace, health and safety of the City, and an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
