

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE.

ORDINANCE NO. 161.

An Ordinance to provide for the construction of
certain sewers.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That there shall be constructed by the City of Lebanon as soon as possible a branch sanitary sewer on the following streets and parts of streets in said City, to-wit: Commencing at the manhole at the corner of Williams and Maple Streets, and running thence East on Maple Street to Hiatt Street, thence North on Hiatt Street to Grant Street, thence Easterly on Grant Street to Walnut Street. Said sewer shall be from fourteen (14) inches to ten (10) inches in diameter, in its various parts, and shall be constructed according to plans to be hereafter prepared by the City Engineer. The cost of said sewer shall not exceed thirty-five hundred dollars (\$3500.00), and the said sum of thirty-five hundred dollars (\$3500.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for said purpose, out of the sewer funds of said City.

Section 2. That there shall be constructed by the City of Lebanon as soon as possible a branch sanitary sewer on Main Street in said City, commencing at the South end of the present sewer on said street, and running thence South on said street to the Canal of the Lebanon Electric Light and Water Company, said sewer to be eight (8) inches in diameter, and to be constructed according to plans to be hereafter prepared by the City Engineer. Said sewer shall cost not to exceed seven hundred thirty dollars (\$730.00), and the said

sum of seven hundred thirty dollars (\$730.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for said purpose out of the sewer funds of said City.

Section 3. That said work shall be done by the City, without advertising for bids or letting contracts therefor; and the City Engineer is hereby authorized and empowered to proceed with said work, to hire and discharge men and teams, purchase and contract for materials and tools, and to bind the said City for payment therefor in amounts not exceeding in the aggregate for either of said branch sewers the amounts hereinbefore appropriated for the same, respectively; provided, however, that the acts of the said City Engineer in the premises shall be at all times subject to the approval, or disapproval and rescission, of the Committee on Sewers and Right-of-Way, and of the Council.

Section 4. Payments for labor and material shall be made from time to time as the work progresses, by warrants drawn upon the Sewer Fund, upon bills duly audited by the Finance Committee and allowed by the Council.

Section 5. Inasmuch as the present sewer system is inadequate to the needs of the City, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance is necessary to the peace, health and safety of the City; therefore, it shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
