

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE.

ORDINANCE NO. 166.

An Ordinance authorizing the Mayor and Recorder to enter into a contract with O. T. Larson, doing business as the Lebanon Sand & Gravel Works, to furnish the City with sand, gravel and crushed rock.

WHEREAS, the City Engineer of the City of Lebanon, Oregon, under authority of the City Council heretofore invited sealed bids for furnishing to said City sand, gravel and crushed rock, and various parties submitted sealed bids therefor, and the same were opened in the presence of the Council at a regular meeting thereof held on the 2nd day of June, 1914; and

WHEREAS, said bids were at said meeting, on motion, referred to the Committee on Streets and Public Property, and said Committee has reported to the Council that the bid of O. T. Larson, doing business as the Lebanon Sand & Gravel Works, is the lowest and best bid, and has recommended that the same be accepted, and said report of the Committee has been accepted and adopted by the Council; now, therefore,

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the bid of the said O. T. Larson, doing business as the Lebanon Sand & Gravel Works, is hereby accepted, and the Mayor and Recorder of said City are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract, on behalf of the City, with said successful bidder, providing for his furnishing to said City, from date of contract to December 31st, 1914, such quantities of sand, gravel and crushed rock

as the City may require, at the prices stated in said bid, to-wit: fordwashed and screened materials, per cubic yard, sand, \$1.00; gravel, \$.85; crushed rock, \$1.25.

Section 2. Inasmuch as said materials are needed for immediate use for the improvement of streets, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance is necessary for the peace, health and safety of the City; therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
