## 4-for 1916 ORDINANCE BILL NO 208 ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE TO TAX, LICENSE AND TO MUZZLE DOGS, AND TO PREVENT 3 THEM FROM RUNNING AT LARGE IN THE CITY LIMITS OF LABANON; AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE IMPOUNDING AND KILLING OF DOGS FOUND RUNNING AT LARGE WITHIN THE SAID CITY, AND TO PROVIDE AGAINST RABLES IN DOGS. 7

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:-8

Section 1. Every person or persons owning and keeping a dog in which is permitted to be or run at large, the city of Lebanon, in Linn County, Oregon/ must apply to the recorder of the said city for a license tag which will be issued to puch person upon him paying to the said recorder the sum of on each male dog and Three Dollars on each female dog. One Dollar. /This Tag must be attached to the dogs collar. Any dog found running at large with the limits of the said City of Lebanon, without a license tag attached to its collar will be immediately impounded in the public pound by any peace officer of pound master.

Section 2- It shall be the duty of the City Marshal, who is exofficio pound master, and evey police of icer of the said City

of Lebanon, Oregon, to take up and impound and confine any dog or

dogs found running at large within the corporate limits of the contrary to the provision of this ordinance, said city of Lebanon, Oregon and as soon as any dog or dogs are

so taken up the said marshal shall post in three public places

in the said City notices describing the said dog or dogs as well

as may be, by giving the sex, breed as best he can and color or

other description describing the said dog or dogs as particular

as practicable, but any description which fairly describes the

said dog or dogs shall be sufficient, which said notices shall

be posted for a period of five days, and giving ntoice that

unless the said dog or dogs are claimed and taken away and the

fees of the said markhal paid that the said dogs or dogs will

be kalled or otherwise disposed of as herein provided.

Section 3- That if such dogs or dogs sp taken up are not claim-1 ed and the said fees of the Marshal paid for the taking up, keeP-2 ing the same with the said five days from the date of of the post-3 ing of the said notices, the said marshal shall offer the said dog or dogs to any person who will pay the said fees and take 5 the said dog or dogs away and keep him away and not permit him within the said city 6 to be or run at large / If no person appears who will claim the 7 said dog or dogs, and take him away the said marshal shall offer 8 such dog or dogs for sale to the highest bidder for cash in hand 9 at the time of sale, and if shall get no bid or offer for the 10 said dog or dogs the said marshal shall immediately kill such 11 dog or dogs and bury or dispose of the carcass thereof as pro-12 vided by law. The fees of the Pound Master shall be, \$1.00 for tak-13 ing up and  $25\phi$  a day for keeping and \$1.00 for killing and disposing of the carcass. 14 Section 4-The license on all dogs running at large in the 15 city of tebanon shall be due and payable on the 1st day of 16 September, of each year, and shall become delinquent on the 17 1st day of ctober of each year, and on and after the said First 18 day of October of each year the Marshall shall at conce take and 19 impound all dogs found running at large within the said City on 20 which the licenst for that year has not been paid and the said 21 license tag attached to the collar of the said dog or dogs, and 22 dispose of such dog or dogs as provided in Section 3 of this 23 ordinance. The owner and keeper of any dog or dogs within the 24 said City shall pay the license fee and procure the license tag 25 each dog owned or kept by him yearly, and procure a new 26 tag and license each and every year. 27 28

Section 5- When an outbreak of rabies occurs or is imminent, no person shall cause or allow or permit any dog owned or kept by whim to run at large within the said city or on any highway or road or on any public domain or on any premises who tenclosed by a dogotight and dog proof fence, unless such dog be securely muzzled so as to effectually prevent its biting any person or

animal. Nothing herein shall be held to require the muzzling of any dog if properly confined on private premises, or on any highway or road if such dog be led by chain or leash in such manner as shall prevent such dog from biting any person or animal. but nothing herein shall be construed to permit any bitch, when in heat, whether muzzled or otherwise, to run at large.

Section 6- Any dog afflicted with rabies, or any dog bitten by a dog, or rabied animal suffering from rabies, is hereby descrared to be a nuisance and such dog must be slain by the owner, or any officer. Excepting that a permit may be issued to an owner exempting from shaughter any dog of great value that has been bitten by a supposedly rabid animal, provided the owner will agree to securely restrain or muzzle said dog for a period of three months or will submit said animal to the pasteur treatment. It shall be the duty of any person owning or keeping any dog that has been bitten by a rabid dog or animal to surrender such dog to a peace officer, unless above exceptions have been complied with.

Section?— Whenever any dog shall have bitten any person and is under suspection of being rabid, at shall be the duty of the owner or any pfficer, to take into his custody and keep such dog under restraint for a period of ten days, during which time a veterination or any other person competent to decide shall determine whether such dog is diseased, and if so, whether in his judgment it should be killed. It shall be the duty of the peace officer or any other person to kill the diseased dog, so condemned by shooting it through the heart.

Section 8- The head of a dog which hasbeen killed under the provisions of Section 7 of this ordinance shall be severed from the body, and spacked in sawdust and ice sent to the the State board of health, in Portland, for examination.

5	the citizens require that this ordinance shall be effective
6	at once, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this or-
7	dinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its
8	passage by the council and approval by the mayor.

12	elected to the council taken by an aye and nay vote.
