

1 ORDINANCE BILL NO. 2, FOR 1918.

2 ORDINANCE NO 221

3 AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE TRAFFIC AND USE OF THE PAVED STREETS
4 OF THE CITY OF LEBANON, FOR HEAVY LOADS; TO PROHIBIT THE HAULING
5 OF LOADS OF MORE THAN FIVE TONS WEIGHT ON ANY PAVED STREET IN SAID
6 CITY; AND TO PROHIBIT TRUCKS OR VEHICLES WITH LOAD OF MORE THAN
7 THREE TONS STANDING ON ANY BITULITHIC PAVEMENT.

8 THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

9 SECTION 1.- It Shall be unlawful for any person, persons, firm,
10 Company or corporation to haul upon or over any paved streets in
11 the City of Lebanon, Oregon, any truck, wagon or other vehicle
12 with a load thereon of more than Five Tons weight. And No person,
13 persons, firm, company or corporation shall be permitted or allow-
14 ed to drive or operate any truck, wagon, or vehicle or trailer up-
15 on or over any paved street in the said city with a load thereon
16 of more than five tons.

17 SECTION 2.- No truck, wagon or vehicle shall be driven, moved
18 or operated upon or over any paved streets in the City of Leban-
19 on faster than eight miles an hour when loaded with a weight of
20 more than Three Tons.

21 SECTION 3- No truck, wagon or vehicle shall be allowed to stand
22 for a longer period than five minutes on any bitulithic pavement
23 in the city of Lebanon when loaded with a weight of more than
24 three tons.

25 SECTION 4.- Any person, persons, firm, company or corporation
26 violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall upon
27 conviction thereof before the Recorder's Court be fined not
28 less than Ten Dollars nor more than ONE HUNDRED Dollars, or be
29 imprisoned in the city jail not less than five days nor more
30 than Fifty days, or both such fine and imprisonment in the dis-
31 cretion of the Court.

32 SECTION 5.- That is as much as the pavements of the City of

1 the city of Lebanon, is being seriously damaged by the hauling
2 of heavy loads thereon, and the lives of the citizens are being en-
3 dangered by fast driving of heavy loads on the said pavements
4 and the peace, health and safety of the said city and its inhabi-
5 tant requires that this ordinance be in force at once an emergency
6 is hereby declared and this ordinance shall be in full force and
7 effect from and after its passage by the council and approval by
8 the mayor.

10 Section, 6.- This ordinance passed by the council this 2nd day
11 of July, 1918, and received more than three-fourth vote of all
12 members elected to the council on the roll call and the vote taken
13 by aye and nay and entered in the journal of the council proceed-
14 ing.
