## ORDINANCE NO 22/

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE TRAFFIC AND USE OF THE PAVED STREETS OF THE CITY OF LEBANON, FOR HEAVY LOADS; TO PROHIBIT THE HAULING OF LOADS OF MORE THAN FIVE TONS WEIGHT ON ANY PAVED STREET IN SAID CITY; AND TO PROHIBIT TRUCKS OR VEHICLES WITH LOAD OF MORE THAN THREE TONS STANDING ON ANY BITULITHIC PAVEMENT.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1.— It Shall be unlawful for any person, persons, firm, Company or corporation to haul upon or over any paved streets in the City of Lebanon, Oregon, any truck, wagon or other vehicle with a load thereon of more than Five Tons weight. And No person, persons, firm, company or corporation shall be permitted or allowed to drive or operate any truck, wagon, or vehicle or trailer upon or over any paved street in the said city with a load thereon of more than five tons.

SECTION 2.- No truck, wagon or vehicle shall be driven, moved or operated upon or over any paved streets in the City of Lebanon faster than eight miles an hour when loaded with a weight of more than Three Tons.

SECTION 3- No truck, wagon or vehicle shall be allowed to stand for a longer period than five minutes on any bitulithic pavement in the city of Lebanon when loaded with a weight of more than three tons.

SECTION 4.— Any person, persons, firm, company or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof before the Recorder's Court be fined not less than Ten Dollars nor more than ONE HUNDRED Dollars, or be imprisoned in the city jail not less than five days nor more than Fifty days, or both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court.

SECTION 5.- That is as much as the pavements of the City of
