1 ORDINANCE BILL NO. 18 for 1919

2 ORDINANCE NO 248

3 AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE STORAGE AND HANDLING OF GASOLINE
4 AND THE MANNER OF THE CONSTRUCTION OF BUILDINGS AND PLACES FOR
5 THE USE OF GASOLINE IN DRY CLEANING ESTABLISHMENTS, AND DECLARING
6 AN EMERGENCY.

7 THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS.

8 SECTION 1. That, from and THE PASSAGE OF THIS ORDINANCE AND I
9 THE APPROVAL OF THE SAME BY THE Mayor of the City of Lebanon, No.
10 gasoline, or distillate shall be stored or kept within the corpor-
11 ate limits of the City of Lebanon, except the same be stored and
12 handled in conformity with the provisions of this ordinance?

13 SECTION 2. That when ever a greater quantity than five gallons
14 of gasoline or distillate be stored or kept within the corporate 1
15 limits of the City of Lebanon, by any person, persons, firm or cor-
16 poration, except when the same shall be stored in the tank of a
17 motor propelled vehicle, said gasoline or distillate shall be stored
18 in a metal tank or tanks of proper weight and thickness not less
19 than three and one half feet under ground and properly vented.

20 SECTION 3. Applications to install gasoline or distillate storage
21 tanks shall be made in writing to the chief of the Lebanon Fire
22 department, or to the fire marshal of the said city if there be such
23 marshal, who shall inspect the premises where storage tank or tanks
24 are to be located and if the same shall meet with his approval, the
25 said chief or marshal shall issue installation permit in writing
26 for the same, subject to his approval upon final inspection of stor-
27 age tank installation before same has been buried.

28 SECTION 4. That when a greater quantity of gasoline or distillate
29 than one quart or less quantity than five gallons be stored or
30 kept within the corporate limits of the City of Lebanon by any
31 person, persons, firm or corporation the said gasoline or distillate
32 shall be kept and contained in an approved metal safety gasoline
33 can.

1 SECTION 5. Every person owning, operating or conducting any gas-
2 oline or distillate dry cleaning plant, where gasoline or distillate
3 is use in such cleaning, shall comply with all the terms of this
4 ordinate^{all} in regard to the storage of said gasoline or distillate
5 and in addition thereto shall have the said plant and the said
6 dry cleaning machinery which uses gasoline or distillate for such
7 cleaning, in a house, room or buildings constructed of cement, or
8 brick and free from any cracks or openings except windows and doors
9 and the^{se} shall be so tight as not to allow fumes or gases from
10 the said plant to escape into any adjoining buildings, or the said
11 building or room may be any non combustible material, but if other
12 than cement or brick the inside of same shall be finished^h with
13 hard plaster and made as tight a possible. The said room or building
14 in which said plant is located shall also have a vent pipe or stack
15 of sufficient size to carry all the fumes and gases of the said
16 plant and shall extend for a distance of not less than one foot
17 above the eve of any and every building within 20 feet of the said
18 plant or building in which it is located, or within 20 feet of the
19 said stack or vent. If the said dry cleaning plant be located out-
20 side of the fire limits of the said city then the same shall not
21 be located closer than 20 feet to any residence and the said vent
22 or stack shall extend at least one foot above the eve of any build-
23 ing within 30 feet of the same.

25 SECTION 6. Application to operate or conduct a gasoline or dis-
26 tillate dry cleaning plant within the corporate limits of the Ci-
27 ty of Lebanon shall be made to the chief of the Lebanon Fire De-
28 partment, or to the Fire marshall if there be one, who shall inspect
29 the premises where the same is to be located and if he approve of
30 the location and establishment of the same and all the require-
31 ments of this ordinance shall have been fully complied with the
32 said chief or marshal shall issue a permit in writing for the
Page establishment and operation of the same, subject to his approval

1 upon the final inspection of the same that the same has been
2 constructed in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance.



4 SECTION 7. Any person, persons or firm or corporation violating
5 any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of
6 a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof before the recorder's
7 Court shall be punished by a fine of not less than Five Dollars,
8 nor more than Fifty Dollars, or by imprisonment in the city jail
9 not less than two days not more than 25 days.

10 SECTION 8. That all ordinances and parts of ordinances in con-
11 flict herewith are herreby repealed.

13 SECTION 9. That in as much as the city of Lebanon has ^{no} ample or
14 sufficient ordinance regarding the use and storage of gasoline
15 and the same is being stored in the busniess center in large quan-
16 tities, and thereby rendefing the health and safety of the city
17 in danger, an emergency is hereby ~~dectared~~ declared to exist and this or-
18 dinance is necessary to preserve the health and safety of the
19 city the same shall be in full force and effect from and after
20 its passage by the council and approval by the mayor.
