

ORDINANCE BILL NO. 29 FOR 1925.

Ordinance No. 348

A BILL FOR an ordinance levying an assessment against all the taxable property in the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, for the year 1926.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, on the 5th day of November, 1925, the Council, acting with six freeholders chosen from the several wards of the city as by law required, prepared an estimate or budget of all money necessary to be raised by taxation for the year 1926 for the purpose of conducting the business of the said City of Lebanon for the year 1926; and

WHEREAS, Thursday, December 3, 1925, was set for the hearing of said budget and whereas notice of such hearing was duly and regularly given, as by law required, and said hearing was on said date and at the place in said notice mentioned, duly and regularly held, and

WHEREAS, a full and complete hearing was had upon said tentative budget and the Council being the levying board of the City of Lebanon, being now fully advised as to the amount necessary to be raised by taxation for all purposes of said City for the year 1926, which said amounts are as follows:

AND, WHEREAS, there is estimated that revenues from other sources other than taxation will accrue to the City of Lebanon during the year 1926 to the amount of Six Hundred and Seventy Dollars (\$670.00)

AND, THEREFORE, there is hereby levied against all taxable property within the corporate limits of the city of Lebanon, Oregon, a total tax amounting to \$24,511.00, for the year 1926.
