

ORDINANCE BILL NO. 5 FOR 1926.

Ordinance No. 353.

An ordinance prohibiting roller skating upon certain streets and parts of streets in Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to skate upon the paved portion of the following described parts of streets in Lebanon, Oregon with roller skates, to-wit:- Main Street from Vine Street to A street; Sherman Street from Park Street to Fourth Street; Grant Street, from Second Street to Park Street, and Second Street from Grant Street to Ash Street.

Section 2. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof before the Recorder's Court of said City shall be punished by a fine of not more than Ten Dollars for any first offense, and by a fine of not more than \$25.00 for subsequent offenses.

Section 3. That on account of the congested traffice by automobiles and trucks upon the parts of the streets above described, skating on said parts of said streets is exceedingly dangerous to those skating, and an emergency exists, and one is hereby declared to exist, and the peace, health and safety of City is endangered, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

Passed by the Council this 16th day of March, 1926.
