

Ordinance Bill no 4 for 1927.

Ordinance No. 362.

A Bill

For an ordinance to amend Section Two of Ordinance No. 248 of the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, relating to the handling and storage of gasoline.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Section Two of Ordinance No. 248 for the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 2. That whenever a greater quantity than five gallons of gasoline or distillate be stored or kept within the corporate limits of the City of Lebanon, by any person, persons, firm or corporation, except when the same shall be stored in the tank of a motor propelled vehicle, (or in the glass or metal receptacle of a stationary gas pump in ordinary use by garages and filling stations and which are approved by the National Board of Fire Underwriters,) the said gasoline or distillate shall be in a metal tank or tanks of proper weight and thickness and not less than three and one half feet under ground and properly vented."

Passed by the Council this 1st day of February, 1927.
