Ordinance Bill No. ~~28~~ for 1927.

Ordinance No. 365.

A BILL

for an ordinance amending ordinance No. 276 of the City of Lebanon, Oregon, passed by the Council June 27, 1921 and approved by the Mayor on the same date, by adding a section thereto to be numbered section 47 a. and providing for the illumination of electric signs, the time during which such signs are to be illuminated and the amount of illumination for such signs, and providing a penalty.

Section 1. Ordinance No. 276 of the City of Lebanon, Oregon, is hereby amended by adding a section thereto to be numbered 47a, which said section shall read as follows:

Section 47a. All electric signs as provided for in section 47 of Ordinance 276 of the City of Lebanon shall be illuminated by at least 50 watts of light to the running foot, provided that in determining whether or not the required lighting is furnished by said sign, the measurement shall be taken of the greatest dimension of said sign; and provided further all such signs shall be illuminated between the time the street lights are illuminated ^{and} until 11 o'clock P.M. each evening. Any person violating any of the provisions of this section shall, upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not to exceed \$25.00, and each evening that any such sign shall not be illuminated shall be considered a separate offense, and when any such sign shall not be illuminated for seven consecutive evenings, the same may, at the option of the Council be declared to be a nuisance and removed. All persons now having electric signs, or other signs which may not conform to said Ordinance 276 shall have thirty days from the passage of this ordinance in which to correct them so as to conform to said ordinance and to this amendment thereof.
