

ORDINANCE NO. 4 FOR 1929.

Ordinance No. 385

A BILL

FOR AN ORDINANCE to amend Section Twenty (20) of Ordinance No. Thirty-three (33) of the City of Lebanon, Oregon, relating to obstruction of sidewalks.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section I. That Section Twenty of Ordinance Number Thirty-three (33) of the City of Lebanon, Oregon, duly passed by the Council on the 23rd day of February, 1894, and approved by the Mayor on the said 23rd day of February, 1894, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 20. All sidewalks and every part thereof within the City Limits shall be kept open at all times and in all respects free from incumbrances or obstructions of any kind, and any person permitting, allowing or maintaining any incumbrance, or any obstruction of any kind on or over any sidewalk or any part thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than Twenty-five Dollars or by imprisonment in the City jail of more than twelve days. Provided that nothing in this section contained shall be construed to prohibit the erection or maintenance of any sign which is now or may hereafter be permitted by any ordinance of the City of Lebanon. Provided that gasoline pumps, duly licensed, are excepted from the provisions of this ordinance.
