ORDINANCE BILL NO. 22 FOR 1929.

ORDINANCE NO. 402

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE amending Section 1 of Ordinance No. 111 of the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, relating to the licensing, regulating, taxing and restraining certain callings, trades and employments, passed by the Council on the 5th day of December, 1911, and approved by the Mayor on the 5th day of December, 1911, as amended by Ordinance No. 318 of the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, passed by the Council on the 21st day of October, 1924, and approved by the Mayor on the 21st day of October, 1924.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That Section 1 of Ordinance No. 111 of the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, relating to the licensing, regulating, taxing and restraining certain callings, trades and employments, passed by the Council on the 5th day of December, 1911, and approved by the Mayor on the 5th day of December, 1911, as amended by Ordinance No. 318 of the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, passed by the Council on the 21st day of October, 1924, and approved by the Mayor on the 21st flay of October, 1924, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 1: Any person, firm or corporation owning, operating or managing any play house, theatre or moving picture theatre within the corporate limits of the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, shall pay therefor a license of Ten Dollars per year, provided that any person taking out a license for a shorter period than one year, shall pay the full license fee, the same to be paid as other licenses are paid to the City. Except as hereinafter, in this ordinance provided, all traveling tent shows, theatrical troupes, carnivals, medicine

shows, and all other like transiet performers or their managers, agents, or proprietors, before showing or performing within the corporate limits of the city of Lebanon shall pay therefor to the City Recorder a license as follows, to-wit: For one day \$50.00; for one week \$250.00; for one quarter \$500.00; provided, however, that any person who owns or operates any moving picture theatre or other regular licensed theater may give theatrical performances in connection therewith in whole or in part without paying any additional license than herein provided for moving picture shows.

Section 2: Whereas, the peace, health and safety of the people of the City of Lebanon require that this ordinance become immediately effective, an energency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
