

ORDINANCE BILL NO. 5 FOR 1931.

ORDINANCE NO. 420

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING THE POLLING PLACES; NAMING THE JUDGES AND CLERKS; PROVIDING FOR THEIR OATH; PROVIDING FOR PRINTING AND DISTRIBUTING PAMPHLETS; PROVIDING BALLOT TITLES FOR MEASURES TO BE VOTED ON; AND PROVIDING FOR PROCURING AND DISTRIBUTING NECESSARY SUPPLIES AND EQUIPMENT FOR THE SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN LEBANON, LINN COUNTY, OREGON, ON THE 20TH DAY OF APRIL, 1931, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TWO CHARTER AMENDMENTS TO THE LEGAL VOTERS OF THE SAID CITY.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The polling places for the special election, to be held on the 20th day of April, 1931, pursuant to Ordinance No. 419, passed by the Council on the 17th day of March, 1931, and approved by the Mayor on the same date, shall be as follows, to-wit:

Ward No. 1. (Lebanon Precinct) City Hall in Mayer Building.

Ward No. 2. (North Lebanon) Old Academy Building on High School grounds.

Ward No. 3. (South Lebanon) Odd Fellows Building.

Section 2. The judges and clerks for said election shall be as follows:

Ward No. 1. (Lebanon Precinct) Judges: J. C. Zimbrick, Chairman; Alice DePew; Celia Sterling. Clerks: Doris Crandall; Myrtle Randall.

Ward No. 2. (North Lebanon) Judges: J. M. Burtenshaw, Chairman; Hallie Cormier; Flora L. Brown. Clerks: Jennie B. Southard; Nan Morris.

Ward No. 3. (South Lebanon) Judges: Ferris Kirkpatrick, Chairman; Eve Irvine; Myrtle Gill. Clerks: Lina Tweed; Sebyl Southard.

Section 3. That previous to entering upon the discharge of their duty, said judges and clerks shall take and subscribe an oath in substantially the following form, to-wit:

"I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will perform the duties of a judge (or clerk as the same may be) of election according to law and the best of my ability; that I will

studiously endeavor to prevent fraud, deceit and abuse in conducting the same".

Said oath to be administered to the said judges and clerks by an officer authorized by law to administer oaths, and in the absence of any such officer, one of the persons chosen to act as judge is hereby empowered to administer the oath to the judges and clerks of said election, and the person administering the oath shall cause an entry thereof to be made and subscribed by him and prefixed to the poll books.

Section 4. That if any judge or clerk of said special election, as above named, shall be absent at the opening of the polls, the electors present may fill such vacancies.


Section 5. The City Recorder is hereby directed and ordered to have printed and to mail to each voter a pamphlet containing a true copy of the ballot title and text of each measure submitted to the voters of the City of Lebanon, pursuant to Resolution No. 4 and 5, duly adopted by the Council on the 17th day of March, 1931, together with the number and form in which the ballot title thereof will be printed on the official ballot at said special election; said ballots to be so mailed not later than the 5th day before the date of said election; and said election shall be given in all respects in the manner provided by Section 71, Article 3, Chapter 4, of the Charter of the City of Lebanon.

Section 6. The City Recorder shall cause to be printed and shall supply a sufficient number of ballots, copies thereof, poll books, ink, pencils, stationery and other necessary and proper supplies for said election and the City Marshall is hereby directed to install voting booths and deliver the ballots, ballot boxes and other supplies to the said judges and clerks of election in the said voting places in due time for their use by the voters, judges, clerks and other persons interested in said special election.

Section 7. This ordinance being necessary for the immediate protection of the public peace, health, safety and morals, the same shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.


