ORDINANCE, NO. 7
FOR 1931.

Ordinance No. 422

A bill for an ordinance vacating all of that part of A Street between Third and Fourth Streets and Third Street between A and B Streets in the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon.

WHEREAS, Frank Gleason, by his duly verified petition, has petitioned the Common Council of the City of Lebanon, for an order vacating A Street between Third and Fourth Streets and Third Street between A and B Streets in the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, subject to the condition that said streets may be re-opened at such time as it shall be necessary or proper for a right of way for a railroad to reach from the present right of way of the Southern Pacific Company to a point west and/or south of the property upon which is now located the lumber-yard and saw-mill of said petitioner or when said premises abutting shall be no longer used for industrial purposes, and

WHEREAS, due notice of the time and place of the hearing of said petition was regularly given as provided by law, and

WHEREAS, Tuesday, April 21, 1931, at the hour of eight o'clock p.m. at the Council Chamber in Lebanon, Oregon, was the time and place fixed for the hearing of said petition, and this being the time and place set for said hearing, and no objection having been filed and no objector now appearing to oppose the vacation of said parts of said streets.

THEREFORE, THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN
AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1-- That those parts of A Street between Third and Fourth Streets and Third Street between A and B Streets in the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, be and the same are hereby vacated until such time as it may become necessary or proper for a right of way for a railroad to extend from the present right of way of the Southern Pacific Company to a point west and/or south of the property upon which is now located the lumber-yard and saw-mill of said petitioner, along either of said streets, or at such time as said premises abutting said streets shall no longer be used for industrial purposes.
