

ORDINANCE BILL NO. 2 FOR 1932.

ORDINANCE NO. 432

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE OPERATION OF TANK WAGONS OR VEHICLES ENGAGED IN THE TRANSPORTATION OR DISTRIBUTION OF VOLATILE OR INFLAMMABLE FLUIDS OR LIQUIDS WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF LEBANON, OREGON.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section I. It is unlawful for any tank wagons or vehicles, engaged or used in the transportation or distribution of any volatile or inflammable fluid or liquid, to be parked at any place within the business, high value or industrial district or fire zone of Lebanon, except for the purpose of discharge or delivery of cargoes, and it is unlawful for any vehicle, engaged or used in the transportation of any such volatile or inflammable fluid or liquid to park or to be parked in any other section of Lebanon at any time for a longer period than thirty minutes.

Section II. It is unlawful at any time to operate, propel or tow as a trailer any tank wagons or vehicles within the City limits of Lebanon, engaged or used in the transportation or distribution of volatile or inflammable fluids or liquids, any part, equipment or appurtenance thereof being in a condition which permits of the leaking, splashing, sloshing or overflowing of the said volatile or inflammable fluid or liquid contents of such vehicle or container thereof which constitutes a hazard to life or property from fire or explosion.

Section III. All tank wagons or vehicles when used for transportation or distribution of volatile or inflammable fluids or liquids, shall be of substantial and workmanlike construction and shall be subject to the approval of the Chief of the Fire Department and/or the City Fire Marshal, who shall inspect and keep a record of such tank wagons or vehicles,

which tank wagons or vehicles shall be plainly marked with a record or serial number, letter or symbol for the purpose of identification. All faucets connected to such tank wagons or vehicles shall be kept locked or have handle removed when not in actual use, such handle to be so constructed that it may not be removed except when the faucet is tightly closed, and all measures and faucets shall be covered or otherwise protected.

Section IV. All such tank wagons or vehicles shall be properly grounded, when provided with rubber tires or non-conductive materials, with a metal chain or other equally conductive device or equipment, to carry off any friction or static spark which may be generated. In the event that wood or other cushion or shock absorbing material be used in the construction of such tank wagons or vehicles the metal parts thereof shall be properly and safely bonded and grounded for the safe conduct of static electricity so as to preclude the possibility of fire or explosion.

Section V. Any person or persons found guilty of the violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not to exceed Twenty-Five (\$25) Dollars or imprisonment for not to exceed Ten (10) Days for each and every act in violation of the provisions hereof, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section VI. This ordinance shall take effect, and its provisions become of full force and effect, immediately after its passage.
