

ORDINANCE BILL NO. 4 FOR 1935.

ORDINANCE NO. 465

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE OPERATION OF MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS AND SOUND PRODUCING DEVICES AND TO ADVERTISING BY RADIO BROADCASTING, AND BROADCASTING BY ANY OTHER MEANS FROM MOTOR OR OTHER VEHICLES UPON THE STREETS OF THE CITY OF LEBANON.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful to operate or to cause or permit to be operated in the City of Lebanon any automatic or electrical piano, phonograph, loud speaker, or any instrument or sound producing or sound amplifying device of like character, so loudly as to disturb persons in the vicinity thereof, or in such a manner as renders the same a public nuisance.

SECTION 2. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation, its agents or employees, from any motor or other vehicle upon the streets or alleys of the City of Lebanon, to broadcast by radio, or broadcast in any other manner by means of a loud speaker or similar device or contrivance, any advertisement, or by such broadcasting to direct attention to any sale, athletic event or competition, dance or dance hall, moving picture show, theatre, or any other business or event, without such permit as is hereinafter provided. This ordinance shall not be construed to apply to radios installed in passenger cars where the same are not used for advertising purposes or are operated in a quiet and inoffensive manner, nor shall this ordinance apply to police cars.

SECTION 3. Whenever it is desired to use a radio, loud speaker, public address system, or similar device upon the streets or upon any motor or other vehicle upon the Streets of the City of Lebanon for the purpose of announcing any game, athletic contest, or event or matter of public interest, the person or organization desiring to do such broadcasting or announcing shall apply to the Chairman of the Committee on Police and Health of the City Council for a permit for such purpose and the said Chairman of the Committee on Police and Health may, in his


discretion, grant such permit if the announcements to be made are, in his opinion, of general public interest. No such permit shall be good for more than one day, and it shall be unlawful to do such broadcasting or announcing without such permit.

SECTION 4. Any person, firm or corporation, its agents or employees, violating any provision of this ordinance, shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined in a sum not exceeding one hundred dollars, or be imprisoned in the city jail not exceeding ten days, or be punished by both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 5. This ordinance being necessary for the immediate protection of the public peace, health, safety and morals, the same shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
