

ORDINANCE BILL NO. 2 FOR 1936

ORDINANCE NO. 472

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE TO LICENSE PIN BALL GAMES AND OTHER GAMES OF LIKE CHARACTER INVOLVING AN ELEMENT OF SKILL, REPEALING ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. DEFINITION. Within the scope and meaning of this Ordinance, pin ball games and other games of like character involving an element of skill are such machines and devices as are designed to be operated or used for amusement, or for playing games, upon the insertion of coins or anything representing coins, and which may be played for money, the representation of money, free plays or merchandise, or for anything representing value, whether paid by such machines or by the proprietor or person in possession thereof.

Section 2. The owner or proprietor of any place of business in the City of Lebanon shall pay to said City a license fee of Three Dollars (\$3.00) per month, or part of month if maintained for less than a month, which license fee shall be paid in advance on the first business day of each and every calendar month for every such machine maintained in such place of business.

Section 3. That such license fee shall be paid to the City Recorder before any such machine shall be maintained or set up, and said Recorder shall issue a sticker showing the payment of the license fee therefor, the name or number of said machine, the name of the person, firm or corporation operating it, the month for which said machine is licensed, the date such sticker was issued, and the endorsement of the City Recorder; and it shall be unlawful to maintain, set up or operate any such machine unless the same shall bear the proper sticker displayed in a conspicuous place thereon showing said license fee to have been paid for the current month in which said machine is maintained or operated.



Section 4. That all such machines shall be operated only in the front or main business room of the place of business where licensed, and no minor under the age of eighteen years shall be permitted to play or operate such machines.

Section 5. That any person or persons violating any provisions or requirements of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof before the Recorder's Court, be fined in a sum not to exceed Fifty Dollars (\$50.00), or confined to the City Jail not more than Twenty-five days, or be punished by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 6. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 7. In as much as pin ball games and other games of like character involving an element of skill are not now licensed and regulated by the City of Lebanon, this Ordinance is declared a measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
