A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE RE-ESTABLISHING THE CURB LINES OF CERTAIN PORTIONS OF SHERMAN AND ASH STREETS, REPEALING ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.


THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the curb lines on either side of Sherman Street between Park Street and the first alley West of Main Street, and on either side of Ash Street between Second Street and the first alley East of Main Street shall be and each thereof is hereby re-established as eight (8) feet from the property line abutting on each of said streets.

Section 2. That all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3. That, Whereas, traffic has become congested on said streets and parking of vehicles thereon has become a serious problem and a large part of the cost of the improvements necessitated by the change of said curb lines will be paid by Federal grant if undertaken at once, this Ordinance being necessary for the public health, peace, and safety, an emergency is hereby declared and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.

Passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor this 15th day of November, 1938.
