WHEREAS, The Common Council of the City of Lebanon, Oregon, did, by Resolution No. 13 for 1940, passed by said Council and approved by the rayor of said City on the 16th day of July, 1940, order the City Engineer of said City to prepare and file plans, specifications and estimates of the cost of construction of a lateral sewer West slong haple Street from Fifth Street to Sixth Street, in the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon; and WHEREAS, The City Engineer, by order of said Council. thereafter prepared and filed plans, specifications, and extimates of the cost thereof, which were approved and accepted by Resolution No. 15 for 1940, passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor on the 6th day of August, 1940; and "HEREAS; Notice of said proposed improvement was thereafter only given in the manner provided by Charter and after hearing thereon said Council found the work necessary and proper and ordered the same to be done; and WHEREAS. The advertising for and letting of bids was thereafter made in the manner provided by Charter, proof of which advertising is on file herein; and WHEREAS, said work has now been completed and approved and the cost thereof has been determined and is the sum of Two Hundred Seventy-six and 18/100 Dollars (276.18), which sum is a smaller emount then the estimate of the cost thereof, filed herein by the City Engineer. NOW, THEREPORE, THE PROPER OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS: Section 1. That the property especially benefitted by said sewer improvement shall pay the cost thereof, which cost is found to be the sum of Two Hundred Seventy-six and 18/100 Dollars. (276.18).

section 2. That the proportionate share of the cost of said improvement to be berne by the real property especially benefitted thereby and to be assessed therefor is hereby declared to be the amount set immediately after the separate description of each of said lots or tracts of land, and each of said lots or tracts of land is determined and declared to be benefitted by said improvement in the sum equal to or greater than the amount assessed thereto as follows: and each of said lots or tracts of land should be, and the same hereby is, assessed the amount set opposite the description thereof, to-wit:
