

ORDINANCE BILL NO. 12 FOR 1941

ORDINANCE NO. 531

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE PARKING OF TRUCKS UPON THE STREETS OF THE CITY OF LEBANON, LINN COUNTY, OREGON, BETWEEN CERTAIN HOURS, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to park, or cause or allow to be parked, any truck or other motor vehicle of a size larger than a pick-up, upon any street within the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, during the period from a half-hour after sunset to a half-hour before sunrise; excepting such trucks or other motor vehicles while loading or unloading in the normal course of business.

Section 2. If any such truck or other motor vehicle cannot be removed from a street within said City because of mechanical difficulties and therefore must remain thereon during said period, the owner, operator or other person in charge thereof shall display or cause to be displayed such flares or other signals as required by the laws of the State of Oregon in regard to a truck or other motor vehicle parked upon a public highway, road or street.

Section 3. Any person, firm or corporation violating any provision of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof in the Recorders Court of the said City of Lebanon, be punished by a fine not exceeding the sum of \$25.00 or by imprisonment in the jail of the said City of Lebanon, not exceeding the period of five days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
