

ORDINANCE BILL NO. 16 FOR 1941

ORDINANCE NO. 535

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE PARKING OF MOTOR AND OTHER VEHICLES UPON CERTAIN STREETS IN THE CITY OF LEBANON, LINN COUNTY, OREGON; PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF; REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 423; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to park or cause to be parked upon Main Street between Maple Street and Ash Street, and upon Sherman Street between the first alley East of Main Street and the first alley West of Main Street, all in the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, any motor vehicle or other conveyance for a period in excess of one hour at any one time between the hours of 8:00 A. M. and 6:00 P. M. on and between Monday and Saturday of each week, inclusive.

Section 2. The Superintendent of Streets of said City is hereby authorized and directed to procure forthwith adequate signs designating such parking regulations, in such number as directed by the Street Committee of the Common Council of said City and to install and maintain the same under the direction of said Committee.

Section 3. The provisions of this Ordinance shall not be in force upon the following legal holidays, to-wit: January 1; May 30; July 4; the first Monday in September, commonly known as Labor Day; November 11; Thanksgiving Day; December 25.

Section 4. Any person violating any provision of this Ordinance shall upon conviction thereof in the Recorder's Court of said City be fined in an amount not to exceed the sum of \$10.00.

Section 5. Ordinance No. 423 is hereby repealed.

Section 6. Inasmuch as the present parking on those parts of the streets herein described is such as greatly to inconvenience the public and create a hazardous condition and said

Ordinance No. 423 is inadequate to cope with this situation, the said Council deems this ordinance necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the people of said City, and an emergency is therefore hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

Passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor this 6th day of May, 1941.
