

ORDINANCE BILL NO. 31 FOR 1941

ORDINANCE NO. 550

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 12 OF ORDINANCE NO. 111, PASSED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL AND APPROVED BY THE MAYOR ON THE 5TH DAY OF DECEMBER, 1911, REGULATING THE OPERATION OF CERTAIN PLACES ON SUNDAY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That section 12 of Ordinance No.111, passed by the Common Council and approved by the Mayor on the 5th day of December, 1911, be and the same hereby is amended to read as follows:

That no person, firm or corporation shall operate or permit to be operated, or keep open or allow to be kept open, any room or place used for any game, sport, recreation or amusement, or where any game, sport, recreation or amusement is usually played or carried on, nor conduct or allow to be conducted in or on such a room or place any game, sport, recreation or amusement upon Sunday of any week, if said person, firm or corporation has a license for the sale of, or sells, or offers for sale, any beer, wine or other intoxicating liquor in, on or about said room or place.

Section 2. The present ordinance provisions governing the above matters being grossly inadequate for the existing situation, and this ordinance therefore being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety of said city, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the council and approval by the Mayor of said City.

Passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor this 15th day of July, 1941.
