

ORDINANCE BILL NO. 2 FOR 1942

ORDINANCE No. 560

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE PROVISIONS OF ARTICLE 5, CHAPTER III, TITLE 115 OF OREGON COMPILED LAWS ANNOTATED, AND ACTS AMENDATORY THEREOF, REPEALING ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH, PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION HEREOF, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That the provisions of Article 5, Chapter III, Title 115 of Oregon Compiled Laws annotated, and acts amendatory thereof, are hereby adopted as the rules governing speeds of motor vehicles within the City of Lebanon in so far as the same apply to the speeds of motor vehicles within incorporated cities of the State of Oregon.

SECTION 2. That any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of Section 1 shall, upon conviction thereof in the Municipal Court, be punished by a fine of not less than \$2.50 and not more than \$100.00, or by imprisonment in the City jail not exceeding 50 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 3. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. In as much as traffic conditions within the limits of the City of Lebanon are a menace to the person and property of the people of said City, an immediate action is required for the protection thereof, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
