ORDINANCE NO. 588

AN ORDINANCE VACATING THE ALLEY IN BLOCK 3, SMITH'S FIRST ADDITION TO LEBANON, LINN COUNTY, OREGON, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS the Lebanon Lumber Company, a corporation, petitions the Common Council of the City of Lebanon for an Ordinance vacating all of the alley between Lot 1 and Lots 7, 8, and 9, in Block 3, Smith's First Addition to Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, running from the intersection of that ~~alley~~ with Fifth Street East a distance of 165 feet; and

WHEREAS the Petitioner is the owner of all the land abutting upon said alley and is the only party interested in or affected by the vacation thereof; and

WHEREAS said alley is a dead end alley and is not used by the public and the public will not be inconvenienced by the vacation thereof; and

WHEREAS the vacation of said alley will permit better use of its property by the abutting property owner,

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That the Lebanon Lumber Company, a corporation, being the only abutting property owner and party to be affected by the vacation of said alley, no notice of facation is required.

SECTION 2. That all of the alley between Lot 1 and Lots 7, 8, and 9, in Block 3, Smith's First Addition to Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, running from the intersection of Fifth Street East a distance of 165 feet, be and the same is hereby vacated.

SECTION 3. That said alley hereby vacated being for the benefit and use of the Petitioner, who operates a large business and furnishes a large pay roll to the people of Lebanon and vicinity, and for the purpose of facilitating its business and


permitting it to make better use of its abutting properties,  
this Ordinance is for the peace, health, and safety of the  
people of Lebanon and an emergency is hereby declared to  
exist, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect  
from and after its passage by the Council and approval by the  
Mayor.

Passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor this 2nd  
day of February, 1943.
