A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE VACATING THE ALLEY BETWEEN LOTS 7 AND 8, RIVERDALE ADDITION TO LEBANON, OREGON, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Howard Crockett and Inez Crockett, husband and wife, and Dart H. Long and Annie L. Long, husband and wife, have petitioned the Council to vacate the alley between Lots 7 and 8, Riverdale Addition to Lebanon, which alley runs from Walnut Street West the length of said lots, a distance of approximately 120 feet; and

WHEREAS, The petitioners are the owners of land abutting upon said alley on both sides and the West end thereof; and

WHEREAS, Said alley is a dead-end alley and is not used by the public and does not give ingress or egress to any dwelling or property not served by a street; and

WHEREAS, The city has heretofore paid Seven and No/100 Dollars (\$7.00) for sidewalk along Walnut Street crossing said alley and Howard Crockett, of said petitioners, has tendered said sum to the city as reimbursement,

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That all abutting property owners having signed said petition and no other parties being effected by the vacation of said alley, no notice thereof is required.

Section 2. That all of said alley between Lots 7 and 8, Riverdale Addition, running from Walnut Street to the West side of said lots be and the same is hereby vacated and



the sum of Seven and No/100 Dollars (\$7.00) tendered by one of said petitioners to reimburse the city for the sidewalk crossing said alley be and the same is hereby accepted.

Section 3. That the land in said alley being necessary for the convenient use of the abutting premises for garden purposes and the gardening season being about to start, this Ordinance is declared to be, necessary for the peace, health, and safety of the people of Lebanon, and an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

Passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor this 4th day of April, 1944.
