A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 485 PASSED BY THE COUNCIL AND APPROVED BY THE MAYOR JANUARY 19, 1937.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That Section 9 of Ordinance No. 485, passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor on the 19th day of January, 1937, be and the same is hereby amended to read and provide as follows:

SECTION 9. No person in charge of a bicycle shall leave said bicycle unattended on any sidewalk in the City except in a public bicycle rack installed on a sidewalk; and when any police officer of the City shall find any bicycle left on any sidewalk, unattended and not in a bicycle rack installed on the sidewalk, it shall be his duty to promptly remove said bicycle to the City Hall and impound the same until the owner or person who was in charge thereof shall pay to the City a fine of \$1.00 to redeem the same.

SECTION 2. The negligence of cyclists in leaving bicycles unattended on sidewalks in the City having become a hazard to pedestrians thereon, and this Ordinance being necessary for the peace, health, safety, and general welfare of the people of the City of Lebanon, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

Passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor this 20th day of March, 1945.
