


ORDINANCE BILL NO. 13 for 1947
ORDINANCE NO. 650

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE No. 644

Section 1. That Ordinance No. 644 Amending Ordinance No. 519 of the City of Lebanon, shall be amended to provide as follows:

SECTION 54 A. That it shall be unlawful for for any person, firm or corporation to cut, dig, or break into any sidewalk, parking strip, curbing or street without making a written application therefor to the Street Commissioner, and depositing with the Recorder the sum of Thirty-Five Dollars (\$35.00) for every such sidewalk, parking strip, curbing and/or street broken into at right angles to the Street; and for every excavation running parallel therewith, a deposit of Thirty-Five Dollars (\$35.00) for the first one hundred feet and Thirty-Five Dollars (\$35.00) for each additional one hundred feet or portion thereof, or a bond approved by the Street Committee in the sum of One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) shall be filed annually in lieu of cash deposits; that such deposit, or bond, shall guarantee the replacement and repair of any of said improvements so broken into in a proper manner as approved by the Street Commissioner within sixty (60) days from the date of said excavation; provided that when any such excavation shall be properly repaired and filled in, the person making the same shall be entitled to receive from the Street Commissioner the written approval of the manner in which said repair was made, and when said approval is received, shall be entitled to the return of the ^{cash} indemnity so deposited with the City; provided further, that if said repair is not made in such manner as shall be approved by the Street Commissioner within sixty (60) days after said street improvement was broken into or excavated, the City shall have the right to properly fill in and repair the same and deduct the cost thereof from the deposit made by the person making such excavation or breaking into said street improvement, and the balance thereof, if there be any, shall be delivered to him.
