

ORDINANCE BILL NUMBER 18 FOR 1948

ORDINANCE NO. 668

AN ORDINANCE CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION ON JULY 20, 1948,
SUBMITTING TO THE VOTERS A BOND ISSUE FOR SEWERS.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That there shall be submitted to the voters of the City of Lebanon for their approval or rejection at a special election to be held in said City on the 20th day of July, 1948, the following proposition:

The City of Lebanon is hereby authorized to issue and sell general obligation bonds of said City in the sum of One Hundred Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$100,000.00) for the purpose of raising funds with which to construct drainage and sanitary main trunk sewer lines for said City, which bonds shall be in such form, be dated and mature as determined by the Council; and the Council shall include in the annual tax levy hereafter, a sum sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds hereby authorized as they become due.

Section 2. That the ballot title for the ballot shall be as follows:

The City of Lebanon is hereby authorized to issue and sell general obligation bonds of said City in the sum of One Hundred Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$100,000.00) for the purpose of raising funds with which to construct drainage and sanitary main trunk sewer lines for said City, which bonds shall be in such form, be dated and mature as determined by the Council; and the Council shall include in the annual tax levy hereafter, a sum sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds hereby authorized as they become due.

Section 3. That the City Recorder is hereby authorized

and instructed to publish notice of said election in the manner provided by law.

Section 4. That the polling places for said election shall be as follows:

WARDS I & II First Presbyterian Church basement;
WARDS III & IV Lebanon High School Gymnasium; Building;
WARDS V & VI ~~Cabin~~ ^{quonset hut} House on Queen Anne School Grounds.

Section 5. That the clerks and judges of said election shall be as follows:

Section 6. That the polling places for said election shall be open from the hour of 8 A. M. to 8 P.M. of said day; that the Chief of Police is instructed to place polling booths, pens, pencils, and ballots for the pur-

pose of providing for said election and the Recorder is directed to provide poll books therefore.

Section 7. In as much as there is a necessity for extending and enlarging the sewer and drainage systems of the City of Lebanon, this Ordinance is for the peace, health, safety and general welfare of the people of said City of Lebanon, and an emergency is therefore hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance shall be in full force from and after its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

Unanimously passed by a quorum of the Council at its regular meeting and approved by the Mayor this 15th day of June, 1948.
