## ORDINANCE BILL NO. 8 FOR 1949 ORDINANCE NO. 688

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION I OF ORDINANCE NO. 545, PASSED BY THE COUNCIL AND APPROVED BY THE MAYOR ON THE 20th DAY OF MAY, 1941, AS AN ENDED BY ORDINANCE NO. 624 ON THE 5 TH DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1945.

The People of the City of Lebanon Do Ordain As Follows:

SECTION I, That Section I of Ordinance No. 545, passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor on the 20th day of May, 1941 as amended by Ordinance 624 passed by the Council and approved by the to provide Mayor on the oth day of November, 1945 be amended/as follows

The following shall be and are hereby declared to be the fire limits of and for the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, to-wit:

Beginning at the intersection of Grove and Isabella Streets in said City; running thence West on Isabella Street to Second Street; thence South on Becond Street to Rose Street; thence West on Rose Street Third Street; thence Bouth on Third Street to Oak Street; thence Bouth on Oak Street to Becond Street; thence Bouth on Becond Street to A Street; thence Bouth on Second Street to A Street; thence Bouth on Street to a point 150 feet West of Main Street; thence Bouth parallel with and at a distance of 150 feet West of Main Street to the Bouth City limit line; thence Bast along the Bouth City limit line to a point 150 feet Bast of Main Street; thence Morth parallel with and at a distance of 150 feet from Main Street to the center of the Lebanon Santiam Canal; thence down the center of the Lebanon Santiam Canal to Grove Street; thence North on Grove Street to Isabella Street.

in accordance herewith which could create a great and continuing danger to persons and property within said City, and particularly within the congested portion thereof which should be restricted, this ordinance is necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety of said city and an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the council and approval by the mayor.
