ORDINANCE BILL NO. 9 FOR 1949

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ORDINANCE NO. 689

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF TIMBER TO JESS FERGUSON AND EDWARD A. LEHNERT FOR \$250.00, AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR AND RECORDER TO EXECUTE AND BELIVER A TIMBER DEED CONVEYING SAID TIMBER TO JESS FERGUSON AND EDWARD A. LEHNERT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORLAIN AS FOLLOWS:

That the sale of the timber hereinafter specified by the Public property Committee of the dity Council of the dity of Lebenon for TWO HUNDRED FIFTY AND NO/100 (\$250.00) DOLLARS be and the same is hereby ratified, affirmed, and approved and the Mayor and the Recorder of said dity are authorized and directed to execute and deliver to Jess Ferguson and Edward A. Lehnert, in the name of the dity of Lebanon, a timber deed of which the following is a substantial copy:

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That the CITY OF LEBANON, a municipal corporation, in consideration of TVO HUNDRED FIFTY AND NO/100 (2250.00) DOLLARS, does hereby grant and convey unto JESS FERGUSON and EDMARD A. LEHNERT, and unto their heirs and assigns all of the merchantable timber located on the following described property:

> Beginning at a point on the North line of and West 62.08 chains from the Northeast corner of the North projection of the william L. whith D.L.C. Nos. 54 and 82 in Township 12 wouth, Ranges 1 and 2 West of the willamette veridian in Linn County, Oregon, said beginning point being 209.0 feet West of the westerly right of way line of Market Wood # 24, and running thence South 208.7 feet; thence west parallel to the North line of sid D.L.C. 82.0 feet; thence South 30 44' West parallel to said road line 525.0 feet; thence Last parallel to the Worth line of said D.L.C. 291.0 feet to the aforesaid road line; thence South 30 44' West along said road line 690.5 feet, more or less to the worth line of the land of the Grantor; thence West along said line to the West line of D.L.C. #82; thence North along said D.L.C. line 21.54 chains to the Northwest corner of said D.L.C. thence Last 13.22 chains, more or less, to the place of beginning, containin 29,5 acres, more or less.

Thes conveyance is subject to and conditioned upon the following terms and conditions.

The loggers shall have the right to use the road now running into the above described property in connection with cutting and removing said timber and to use the premises for any and all reasonable purposes in connection with the logging operations, provided, how ver, that the loggers shall at all times keep the road in a good state of repair and shall not block or obstruct in any menner that portion of the road between said County road and the city dump ground meaning by this provision, that the loggersshall not permit trucks to be parked upon or to use said portion of read in connection with loading the logs onto the trucks, and at all times give preference to W. A. Clendenen, who has a contract with the City of "ebanon for disposal of garbage,

The loggers shall have until the 1st day of July, 1949, within which to cut and remove said timber and any timber remaining on the premises after that date shall revert to and become the property of the owner free and clear of all claims by the loggers and thereafter the loggers shall have no further right upon the premises.

The loggers shall carry on their operations in an efficient workman like manner and in full compliance with the United States, State of Gregon, and all lawful rules and regulations of any lawful governmental authority which has jurisdiction over logging and logging operations and operation in the area where said timber is to be logged.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, the said premises, with their appurtenances, unto the said grantees, theirheirs and assigns forever.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, said City of Lebanon, Oregon has, by authority of its Common Council, caused these presents to be executed in its Corporate name by its Layor and Recorder and its Corporate leal to be hereunto affixed this / 5 day of March, 1949.

That the said City of Lebanon having seriously depleted its funds, and this Ordinance therefore being required for the peace, health and safety of said City, an emergency is hereby declared and said Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
