

ORDINANCE BILL NO. 47 FOR 1950

ORDINANCE NO. 790

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR MINORS TO ENTER ESTABLISHMENTS WHERE INTOXICATING LIQUORS ARE SOLD, AND FOR PARENTS OR OTHER PERSONS TO PERMIT MINORS TO ACCOMPANY THEM INTO SUCH ESTABLISHMENTS, AND ALSO MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR OWNERS AND EMPLOYEES TO PERMIT MINORS TO REMAIN THEREIN, PROVIDING A PENALTY, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY:

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of 21 years to enter , or for any owner, proprietor or employee to permit any person under the age of 21 years to remain, in any place of business within the City of Lebanon where intoxicating liquors are sold.


It shall also be unlawful for any parent or other person having the care, custody and control of any person under the age of 21 years to permit such minor to enter any place where intoxicating liquors are sold.

For the purpose of this ordinance a place where intoxicating liquors are sold shall not mean a place where the same is sold in packages only.


Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not more than \$200.00 or by imprisonment in the City jail for a term of not more than 100 days or by both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the Court.

That existing conditions are such that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared and said ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

Passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor this 18th day of July, 1950.
