32N ORDINANCE BILL NO. 50 FOR 1950 ORDINANCE NO. 793 A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 790 MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR MINORS TO LOITER, OR OWNERS OR EMPLOYEES TO PERMIT MINORS TO LOITER, AND PARENTS OR OTHER PERSONS HAVING THE CUSTODY OF MINORS TO PERMIT THEM TO LOITER IN ESTABLISHMENTS WHERE INTOXICATING LIQUORS ARE SOLD, PROVIDING A PENALTY AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY: THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS: It shall be unlawful for any minor to loiter, or for any owner, proprietor or employee, or any parent or other person having the care, custody and control of any minor to permit such minor to loiter in any place where intoxicating liquors are sold. For the purpose of this ordinance a place where intoxicating liquors are sold shall not mean a place where the same is sold in packages only. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not more than \$200.00 or by imprisonment in the City jail for a term of not more than 100 days or by both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the Court. That existing conditions are such that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared and said ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
