Ordinance No. 826

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE OPERATION OF A MOTOR VEHICLE UPON THE STREETS OF LEBANON WITHOUT LAWFUL LICENSE PLATES, PROVIDING A PENALTY AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

The People of the City of Lebanon Do Ordain as Follows:

No person shall operate or drive a motor vehicle upon any street or thoroughfare within the corporate limits of the City of Lebanon, unless the vehicle shall have the license plates assigned to it by the Secretary of State, of the State of Oregon, conspicuously displayed on the front and rear of the vehicle in plain view and so as to be easily read by the public and it shall be unlawful to display any number which does not entitle the holder thereof to operate such vehicle upon the public highways of the State of Oregon, provided, however, that a sticker evidencing a temporary permit affixed to the glass windshield of a motor vehicle displaying a number which entitles the holder thereof to operate said vehicle upon the highways of the State of Oregon, pending the issuance of permanent license plates, or yearly insert plates, shall be a lawful substitute for such number plates, or yearly insert plates.

Any person who violates any of the provisions of this Ordinance or who fails to cause to be displayed upon any motor vehicle operated by him on any street or thoroughfare within the corporate limits of the City of Lebanon, the number plates and yearly insert plates required by this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, or upon entering a plea of guilty, to a complaint charging him with violation of this Ordinance, be punished by a fine not to exceed \$200.00 or imprisonment in the city jail for a period not to exceed 100 days or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

This ordinance being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

Passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor this 6th day of November, 1951.
