LOCATED BETWEEN DODGE AND CAROLINE)
STREET, WEST OF GROVE STREET,)
COMMONLY KNOWN AS THE METHODIST)
EPISCOPAL CEMETERY, THE REMAINS OF)
ANY DECEASED HUMAN BEING.)

ORDINANCE NO. 835

Whereas, the area surrounding and adjacent to the cemetery named in the title of this ordinance, has during the past years become thickly populated to the extent that any future burials therein might be injurious to peace and health of those persons living in the surrounding area, and,

Whereas, it is necessary that Council action be taken to prevent future interment.


NOW THEREFORE THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to inter or cause to be interred in the Methodist Episcopal Cemetery, located west of Grove Street between Dodge and Carolina Streets, the remains of any deceased person.

2. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of the ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not less than \$200.00 or by imprisonment in the city jail for not less than 100 days or by both such fine and imprisonment.

3. This ordinance being necessary for the immediate public peace, health and safety, for the reason above stated, an emergency is declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

Passed by the Common Council and approved by the Mayor on the 5th day of February, 1952.
