

ORDINANCE BILL NO. 19 FOR 1953

ORDINANCE NO. 868

AN ORDINANCE RE-ENACTING ORDINANCE NO. 157, WHICH WAS PASSED BY THE COUNCIL AND APPROVED BY THE MAYOR THE 21ST DAY OF APRIL, 1914, CONCERNING THE REGULATION OF POOL TABLES AND BILLIARD TABLES KEPT BY OR FOR CORPORATIONS, ASSOCIATIONS, SOCIETIES, AND CLUBS.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the owners, lessees, and persons in charge of any and all pool tables and billiard tables kept, conducted, or operated in the City of Lebanon, Oregon, by or for the use of the members of any corporation, association, society, or club, and of the rooms where such tables are so kept, conducted, or operated, shall comply in all respects with the provisions and requirements of the ordinances of said city in regard to the keeping of billiard and pool tables for hire or profit.

Section 2. Any person, whether as principal, agent, or employee violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$100.00, or by imprisonment for not less than five days nor more than Fifty days, or both.

Section 3. It is hereby declared that, because the ordinance which this ordinance amends, did not contain a proper ordaining clause its validity may be questioned and it is important that the regulations set forth in said ordinance be in full force and effect immediately, and this ordinance being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist and this ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.
