

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE CALLING A
SPECIAL ELECTION AT THE SAME TIME
AND PLACE AS THE GENERAL ELECTION
TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 2, 1954 IN
THE CITY OF LEBANON, FOR THE PUR-
POSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE VOTERS
OF SAID CITY FOR THEIR APPROVAL
OR REJECTION A PROPOSAL AUTHORIZ-
ING THE LEVY BY THE CITY OF A 5
MILL TAX OUTSIDE THE CONSTITU-
TIONAL LIMITATIONS FOR THE PUR-
POSE OF PROVIDING FUNDS FOR THE
COST OF FUTURE DEVELOPEMENT OF
THE SEWER SYSTEM OF LEBANON, AC-
QUISITION AND DEVELOPEMENT OF
PARKS AND CONDEMNATION AND ACQU-
ISITION OF THE CEMETARY PROPERTY
LOCATED BETWEEN CAROLINA AND
DODGE STREETS, WEST OF GROVE STREET
AND OTHER EXPENSES INCIDENTAL THERE-
TO AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

ORDINANCE BILL NO. 12 FOR 1954
ORDINANCE NO. 885

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOL-
LOWS:

That a Special Election shall be held in the City
of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, at the same time and
same places as the general election will be held, namely
November 2, 1954, at which election there shall be sub-
mitted to the legal voters of said City, for their appro-
val or rejection, the following proposed tax levy, which
is now on file in the office of the City Recorder of the
City of Lebanon, and which has been proposed by the City
Council by a resolution unanimously passed on the 21st
day of September, 1954, to-wit:

AN ACT Authorizing A Special Levy For Sewer System, Parks
And Condemnation Of The Cemetary Between Carolina And
Dodge Streets And West Of Grove Street And Expenses In-
cidental Thereto

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

That the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, by
and through its City Council, be and it is authorized
and empowered to levy a 5 mill tax against all taxable

property within the corporate limits of said City, outside the limitations imposed by Article XI, Section II, of the Constitution of the State of Oregon for each of the 5 tax years beginning with the fiscal tax year, 1955-56 to and including the fiscal tax year of 1959-60 for the purpose of providing funds for the future development of the sewer system of the said City including the construction of sewer lines and additions to the sewage disposal plant, acquisition and development of park sites, condemnation and acquisition of the cemetery property located between Carolina and Dodge Streets and West of Grove Street in said City and all expenses incidental thereto, and for all or any one or combination of such purposes, and to use the funds derived from such tax for such purposes.

That the Ballot Title of said proposed proposition submitted by the City Attorney is hereby approved and shall be as follows:

BALLOT TITLE

An act authorizing the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, by its City Council to levy, for the purpose of providing and using funds for the future development of the sewer system, acquisition and development of parks, condemnation and acquisition of the cemetery between Carolina and Dodge Streets, West of Grove Street, a 5 mill tax against all taxable property within the limits of said City outside the constitutional 6 per cent limitation of the State of Oregon for each of the 5 fiscal tax years, 1955-56 to 1959-60 inclusive.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That the foregoing proposed proposition be forthwith filed with the City Recorder for submission by her to the legal voters of the City of Lebanon at a special election called for the purpose of voting on said proposition at the same time as the general election on November 2, 1954.

That the said proposal for authorization of special tax levy shall be placed upon the official ballot by the City Recorder to be voted upon by the legal voters of said City at said election.

That the City Recorder shall provide such poll books, ballot boxes, tally sheets, and such other supplies for each polling place, hereinafter designated, as are necessary for carrying on of the election which shall be delivered to the election board.

That the Common Council does hereby designate and appoint as the polling places and as the judges and clerks of said special election the same polling places, judges, and clerks as shall hereafter be designated by the County Clerk of Linn County, Oregon, as the polling places, judges, and clerks for the general election to be held on November 2, 1954 and the Recorder is hereby directed, at the time of such designation, to insert at the appropriate place hereinafter in this ordinance provided, the names of the polling places and the judges and the clerks so designated.

That the polls shall be opened in each of said voting precincts at 8 o'clock A. M., and shall be kept open until 8 o'clock P. M. of said Special Election Day, and that the ballots cast at said Special Election shall be counted, tabulated, and returned to the City Recorder of said City in the manner provided by law.

That the City Recorder of said City be and she is hereby directed to give notice of said special election by publication thereof in the Lebanon Express, a newspaper of general circulation, published in Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, once a week for 2 successive and consecutive weeks within 30 days next preceding said election and of the measures to be voted upon at such election, which notice shall also contain the places designated for holding said Special Election as in this ordinance provided, and the said City Recorder be and she is hereby directed to prepare and cause to be distributed unto the legal voters of said City voters pamphlets concerning said tax levy proposal in the manner provided by law.

WHEREAS, the City Council has declared that the cemetery described in this ordinance is an abandoned cemetery and overgrown with weeds, trees, and shrubs, and is so located as to endanger the health, welfare, comfort and safety of the public and that the public welfare requires that the cemetery be discontinued, re-located and cleared, and

WHEREAS, because of the possibility of annexation of territory adjacent to the City, funds will be required to pay the expenses of improving the sewer system and extending sewer lines and it is necessary that a special levy be authorized for this purpose, and

WHEREAS, in order to get the measure on the ballot at the time of the general election to be held on November 2, 1954, it is necessary that this ordinance become effective immediately,

THEREFORE, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and it is hereby declared to be necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the City of Lebanon that this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.
