ORDINANCE BILL NO. 16 FOR 1954 ORDINANCE NO. 889

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

That subsection C of Section 2 of Ordinance No. 886 shall be amended to read as follows:

Section 204 of the Uniform Building Code adopted by this ordinance shall be amended by changing the figure, \$300.00 to \$200.00 and by adding thereto the following: "Provided however, that if any person shall build, or shall commence to build, or shall repair or commence to repair, any building or structure covered by the Uniform Building Code adopted by this ordinance without having first secured a permit therefor as recuired by said Uniform Building Code, such person shall, upon notice or demand being made upon him by the building inspector of the City of Lebanon that he secure a building permit before proceeding with such construction or repair, promptly stop all work on such construction or repair, and shall not resume such work until a building permit has been secured therefor. As a penalty for not having secured the building permit as required by the said Uniform Building Code, such person shall pay for said permit, the building permit fee provided in subsection D of Ordinance 886, and in addition thereto, shall pay an additional fee which shall be equal to the building permit fee or the sum of \$10.00, whichever amount is the smallest. If such person secures such

building permit and pays the fee required by this section, such person shall be exhonerated from any other penalty provided for in said Section 204 of the Uniform Building Code. For the purpose of the foregoing, the term person shall mean any person, male or female, firm or corporation or any contractor, subcontractor or carpenter who is the owner of or who is in charge of the construction of a building.

It is hereby adjudged and declared that because the penalty provided in Section 204 of Uniform Building Code is too severe in some cases and no provision is provided in said building code for a lighter penalty to be imposed without court action. This ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety and an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council and approval by the mayor.
