

AN ORDINANCE SETTING THE SALARIES OF CERTAIN OFFICERS OF THE CITY OF LEBANON, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

ORDINANCE NO. 926

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That the monthly salaries of the following city officers commencing January 1, 1956, and continuing until further ordinance of the Council, shall be in the amounts set after the office as follows:

City Recorder-Treasurer	\$425.00
Assistant City Recorder	300.00
Chief of Police	425.00
Other full time Police Officers	325.00
Police officer on desk	225.00
Paid Fireman	325.00
Street Superintendent	425.00
Other Street Employees	325.00
City Attorney	140.00
Assistant Chief of Police	362.50
Disposal Plant Operator	325.00
Building Inspector	100.00

Section 2: That all ordinances or parts of ordinances which are in conflict hereunder be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 3: Inasmuch as the above mentioned salaries are to be effective January 1, 1956, and it is necessary that the City have in its employ the above named persons, and this ordinance being necessary for the peace, health, and safety of the people of the City of Lebanon, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
