THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:


Section (1) It shall be unlawful for any pedestrian to cross any public street within the City of Lebanon at any place other than the painted <sup>Amended by 963</sup> ~~yellow~~ cross walks at the various intersections within the City of Lebanon, unless there shall be no marked cross walk within 200 feet from the point of crossing said public street.

Section (2) It shall be unlawful for any pedestrian to cross any street in the City of Lebanon in marked cross walks at intersections that are controlled by electrical "wait-walk" signals unless said signal shall at the time such persons cross said street designate "walk."

Section (3) That any person violating the terms of this Ordinance, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined a sum not to exceed \$100.00.

Section (4) That the traffic lights in the City of Lebanon are about to be put into operation and it is necessary for the health, peace, safety and welfare of the people of the City of Lebanon that this Ordinance be effective at once, therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
