

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE TAKING JURISDICTION OF  
 THE FOLLOWING PROPOSED IMPROVEMENT DISTRICTS:  
 HIATT STREET FROM ROSE TO DODGE STREETS; WILLIAMS  
 STREET FROM GRANT TO WHEELER STREETS; DODGE  
 STREET FROM MAIN TO PARK STREETS; SEVENTH STREET  
 FROM OAK TO "D" STREETS; SECOND STREET FROM END  
 OF PAVING TO SO. CITY LIMITS; MILTON STREET FROM  
 WILLIAMS STREET TO EAST END OF MILTON; AND THE  
 ALLEY FROM MAPLE STREET TO OAK STREET LYING  
 BETWEEN MAIN STREET AND PARK STREET, ORDERING  
 THE SAME TO BE DONE BY CONTRACT TO BE AWARDED  
 TO THE LOWEST RESPONSIBLE BIDDER, AND DIRECTING  
 THE CITY RECORDER TO PUBLISH NOTICE INVITING  
 PROPOSALS FOR BIDS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

 ORDINANCE NO. 943

WHEREAS, there has been filed herein petitions signed by the owners of more than 50 per cent of the real property abutting upon and to be benefitted by the above described street improvements, which petitions have been approved by the Council, and

WHEREAS, the Council thereafter approved the plans, specifications and estimates of the cost of making said improvements, and caused notice of intention to make said improvements to be published in the manner provided by the Charter, and

WHEREAS, the time for remonstrances to be made to said street improvements has elapsed and no remonstrances have been made or filed herein, now therefore,

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

I.

That the Council does hereby take jurisdiction of the proposed street improvements, in each of the above named street improvements districts, and orders that the street improvement in each of said districts shall be done by contract to be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder with the right of the City to refuse any and all bids.

II.

That the Recorder is hereby ordered to publish for ten days in a newspaper published in Lebanon, Oregon, a notice inviting proposals for making the street improvements in each of the above named street improvement districts, said notice to be published in such a manner that bids may be received for each of said districts or for all of said districts and referring

in said notice to the plans and specifications therefore filed in the office of the Recorder and the time when said work shall be completed.

III.

That said work in each and all of said districts shall commence not later than JULY 15, 1956 and shall be completed not later than SEPT. 15, 1956.

IV.

That said work in each and all of said districts shall be done in the manner provided by the plans and specifications heretofore filed by the City Engineer and approved by the Council, and the contractor shall be subject to the penalties for default or failure to complete said work in the manner and within the time provided by his contract with the City, and shall indemnify the City by a bond in an appropriate amount, with a surety or sureties approved by the Council for the faithful and prompt performance of said contract and for the payment of damages for the failure thereof in the sum or sums provided in said contract.

V.

That existing conditions are such that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety, and an emergency is hereby declared and said ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

Passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor this 5<sup>th</sup> day of June, 1956.
