The People of the City of Lebanon do Ordain as Follows:


Section 1: That the monthly salaries of the following city officers commencing July 1, 1956, and continuing until further ordinance of the Council, shall be in the amounts set after the office as follows:

City Recorder-Treasurer	\$450.00
Assistant City Recorder	325.00
Chief of Police	450.00
Other full time Police Officers	350.00
Police Matron & Radio Operator	240.00
Paid Fireman	350.00
Street Superintendent	450.00
Other Street Employees	350.00
Municipal Judge, Dist. #1	50.00
Municipal Judge, Dist. #2	10.00 per hour
Assistant Chief of Police	387.50
Disposal Plant Operator	350.00
Building Inspector	100.00
City Attorney	420.00 quarterly

Section 2: That all ordinances or parts of ordinances which are in conflict hereunder be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 3: That the 1956-57 budget which has been adopted calls for the above sums of money to be paid to the respective officers and employees during the fiscal year July 1, 1956, through June 30, 1957, and that the various officers and employees above named have relied upon said salaries. Therefore, this Ordinance is necessary for the peace, health and safety of the people of the City of Lebanon and an emergency is hereby declared to exist. Therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately after it is passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor.
